Air Conditioning/Heating – The air conditioners in Alicante are technically called “water source heat pumps”. In this type of system, a water loop connects the cooling tower and boilers at the top of the building with all of the heat pumps located in condos and common areas throughout Alicante.

To Cool: The heat pump moves heat from a room's air to the water loop. The cooling tower moves excess heat from the water loop to the outdoors.

To Heat: The heat pump moves heat from the water loop to a room's air. The boilers at the top of the building reheat the water in the loop.

Since this system is specialized to newer high rises, ensure you contact an experienced vendor. Here is a list of vendors who you may want to consider:

Plumbing – The plumbing in a high-rise building differs from residential plumbing. For example, Alicante's plumbing is arranged in vertical stacks that feed to horizontal lines in the garage that flow out to the city sewer system.

Because every building is unique, we recommend using plumbers familiar with the plumbing systems at Alicante. You may want to use one of the following:

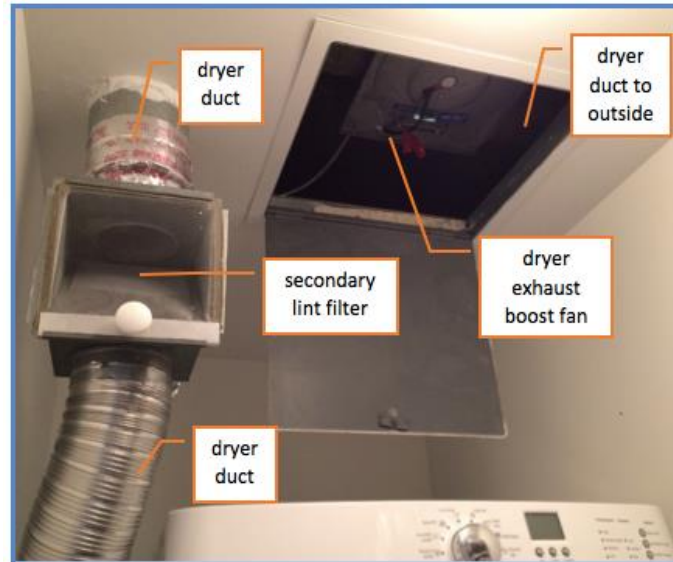

Dryer Ducts – The clothes dryers in Alicante use an exhaust system that is specific to high-rise buildings. This photo of an Alicante laundry closet shows the exhaust system's parts:



- The duct from the dryer to the secondary lint filter
- The secondary lint filter
- The duct from the secondary lint filter to the dryer exhaust boost fan
- The exhaust boost fan (**Fan should turn on automatically when dryer running!**)
- The ecodeuct that runs from the boost fan through the ceiling to the outside of the building.

The secondary lint filter needs to be cleaned regularly, just like you would clean the dryer lint trap.

In addition, the entire dryer exhaust system must be cleaned periodically to prevent lint blockages. If a blockage occurs, or if the boost fan is not working properly:

- Warm moist air may collect in the duct; condensation may leak from the duct into your ceiling.
- Drying times will be noticeably longer, using more electricity
- **Lint blockages are a fire hazard.** There have been cases of lint catching fire, causing extensive damage.
